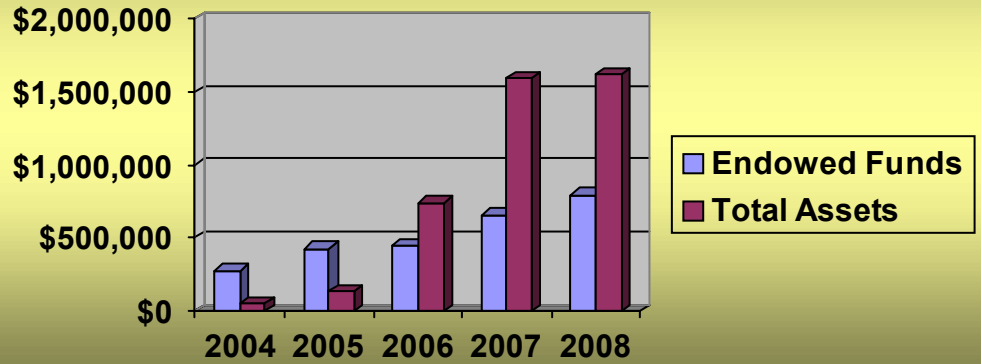

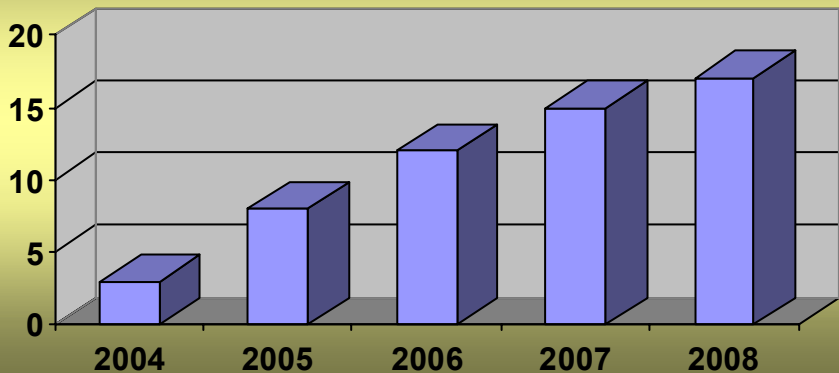

Jones Student Center Multiplex. This gift was the first major gift of the Multiplex effort. The Paul R. Jones Multiplex will house a student center, cafeteria, reading and meeting rooms, state-of-the-art library and other features. On The River Manatawny... A Tribute to Dr. Harold L. Anthony, Sr. Our Beloved Teacher, Choir Director and Songwriter

Professor Harold Leonard Anthony, Sr. passed away on Monday, June 30, 2008. He was born on October 16th, 1928 in Marshall Texas, and adopted at an early age by Emanuel and Roberta Anthony of Marshall. He demonstrated an affinity for music and singing, sharing his love and enthusiasm for music with others in the community and in church. This early affinity would ultimately lead to a life's work of service, teaching music theory, musicianship, piano, voice, and directing various choral groups.

He will be remembered for his commitment to excellence in all things rendered unto God and his engaging and often humorous personality, which afforded him a unique ability to connect with a multitude of people.

Professor Anthony is survived by his devoted and loving wife Nell Rice Anthony, his son Harold Leonard Anthony, Jr. and daughter-in-law Angel Lee Anthony; foster son Timothy Edward Witherspoon, brother Clifford Lee Moody of California, sister Doris Foster of California, nephew Rev. DAVID LEWIS GREEN, SR.

“Sweet Singer of Israel”

(June 13, 1936 – June 7, 2008)

On June 7, 2008, the rich melodious tenor voice of David Lewis Green, Sr. was stilled as he took his final rest. He was born and raised in Chester, Pennsylvania on June 13, 1936 the tenth of the twelve children born to Allie Mae Searles Green and Frank Green. Mr. Green’s musical journey began at a very early age when he sang in the children’s choir of his church, Temple Baptist, under the direction of his mother. One of his elementary school teachers encouraged young David to develop his natural talent for singing. At age 9, he performed *The Lord’s Prayer* by Malotte with the command beyond his years. When he was 14 years old he sang and met the challenge of the tenor solo *Comfort Ye* from *Handel’s Messiah*.

Mr. Green was introduced to the Seventh-day Adventist church through the invitation by a high school classmate to sing for an evangelistic crusade. At the end of the crusade, he was baptized by the late Elder W.A. Thompson and became a member of the Macedonia Seventh-day Adventist Church. Enthusiastic about his new-found faith, Mr. Green became interested in the ministry and went to Oakwood College to study ministry. Once there, he was led by the Holy Spirit to realize he could serve the Lord better through his God-given talent in music. He sang in several musical groups at Oakwood including the Aeolians. He was often described as the “sweet singer of Israel”.

It was at Oakwood that Mr. Green met his wife and soul-mate of 50 years, Dorothy Mae Lea. On May 11, 1958, they were united in marriage at the Ephesus Seventh-day Adventist Church in Harlem, New York. From their union were born three children, Devie Lanice, David Lewis, Jr. and Derrick Lawrance. During the early years of his marriage, Mr. Green was drafted into the U.S. Army. Upon completion of his service, David moved his family to South Lancaster, Massachusetts to pursue his music studies at Atlantic Union College. He graduated from the college with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Music Education. He later obtained a Masters of Arts degree in Education and Supervision from Clark Atlanta University, Atlanta, Georgia.

Mr. Green was the consummate musician. He performed, taught and directed music! His vast teaching experience includes music teacher, band and choir director at Northeastern Academy, Bronx, New York, music teacher, Nanuet Public School System, Nanuet, New York, choir/band director and Bible teacher, Greater Atlanta Adventist Academy. As a school administrator, Mr. Green was a Principal of Ramah Jr. Academy, Cleveland, Oh, V. Lindsay School/Central States Jr. Academy, Kansas City Kansas and Missouri and Trinity Temple Jr. Academy, Hillside New Jersey.

Mr. Green served as band/choir director at Pine Forge Academy from 1972 to 1977. During his tenure there, he was the catalyst for the production of the album, “Sing Unto God” which featured the PFA Choir and Band. Wherever he taught, Mr. Green challenged his students with complex and sophisticated songs. He inspired them achieve a high-level of musicianship by exposing them to music beyond their preferences and backgrounds.

On December 2, 1989, Mr. Green’s life was changed instantaneously and irrevocably when his car was hit by a drunk driver, an accident which left him paralyzed. After numerous surgeries and months in the hospital and rehab facility, Mr. Green emerged with a new-found strength for the return to his family, students and principle-ship. He resumed working for three more years before his retirement. During his retirement, Mr. Green was active in his church as the director of the Sanctuary Choir at the Seabrook Seventh-day Adventist Church. Under his direction the choir was often described as “a host of angels”. His dedicated service and extraordinary musicianship was acknowledged by the Adventist Guild of Musicians. Mr. Green received the award for Choral Director of the Year.

“When he speaks, David Green’s voice is thin and wispy, as if he must strain to form each precise word. But, when the 71 year-old choir directors sings ..., his voice is transformed into a rich and booming instrument. It is the voice of a man who has been teaching others to sing for 43 years and it cannot be diminished just because the body that surrounds it has been damaged.” (Washington Post, December 19, 2007). Mr. Green’s musical legacy will live on in the hundreds of students who were privileged to study, sing and play an instrument under his extraordinary tutelage!



Board Steps Up Transparency, Accountability, Stewardship

At the May, 2008 board meeting, the Board of Directors took an bold action to be more accountable and transparent regarding board participation and giving performance. In 2007, the Board took an action to require all board members to commit to at least \$5,000 with an annual minimum gift of at least \$1,000 per year . Starting with August 1, 2008, the Board Chair, through a board action, will provide a quarterly report, showing the individual board member giving history and compliance with meeting the annual commitment.

“ This action is just another move towards greater board governance by walking the talk”, said Dr. W. Wendell Cheatham, board members who championed the move.

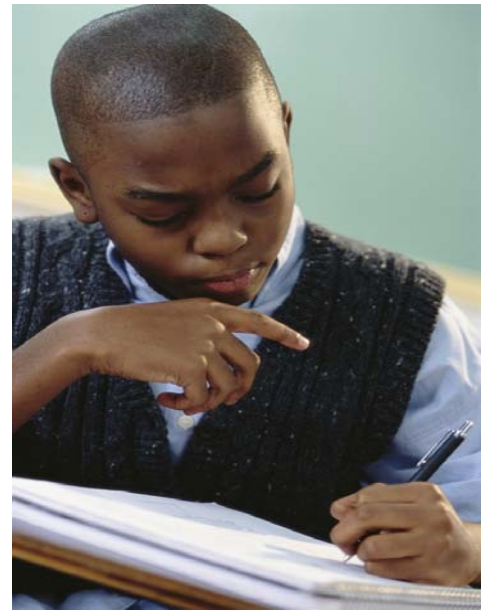
